Mayor McKean called the meeting to order with all members in attendance.

▪ **Adoption of Consent Agenda**

B. Deputations / Presentations / Public Meeting

Mayor McKean noted under the authority of the *Municipal Act, 2001* and in accordance with Ontario's *Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (MFIPPA), The Corporation of the Town of The Blue Mountains wishes to inform the public that all information including opinions, presentations, reports and documentation provided for or at a Public Meeting, Public Consultation, or other Public Process are considered part of the public record. This information may be posted on the Town's website and or/ made available to the public upon request.

B.1 Public Meeting: Proposed New Sign By-law

Mayor McKean read the Notice of Public Open House and Public Meeting for the proposed new Sign By-law. Take notice that on Monday, May 30, 2016, the Council of The Corporation of the Town of The Blue Mountains will host a Public Open House and a Public Meeting to consider the proposed Sign By-law.

The Clerk noted that notice of the public meeting was given in accordance with the Corporate Provision of Notice Policy, and that in response comments were received from Robert B. Waing, Dave Hannam of Zelinka Priamo Ltd., Lindsay Ayers of Blue Mountain Resorts, and Blue Mountain Ratepayers Association.

John noted the Public Open House is an opportunity for the public to get information with respect to the proposed Sign By-law and to ask questions about the proposed changes.

John noted any Person may attend the public meeting and/or make written or verbal representation either in support of or in opposition to the proposed Sign By-law.

Consultant Jim Dymont spoke noting he started working on the new sign by-law approximately one year ago, noting that the objective was to take the existing by-law and make it more user-friendly. Jim noted that it was decided that a new by-law, that included graphics and photos would be drafted, further noting that the new by-law would have an eye to the design and character of The Blue Mountains. Jim noted that a public open house has been held to receive comments on the draft by-law.

Jim then reviewed the draft by-law, including the number of signs per building permitted, and backlighting in industrial and commercial areas.

Jim spoke regarding the comments of the Blue Mountain Ratepayers Association and Blue Mountain Resorts.

Jim noted that all comments received will be summarized and that he will bring a report to a future Committee of the Whole meeting to respond to the comments and provide recommendations to Council.

Councillor Halos spoke noting that we need to keep The Blue Mountains brand in mind, further questioning why billboard signs cannot be prohibited. Joe noted that back-lighting is not permitted, and questioned if backlighting projects more light than front-lighting. Jim spoke in response noting he will research in the Municipal Act as to whether billboard signs can be prohibited.

Deputy Mayor Ardiel spoke noting the current sign by-law includes a provision about abandoned billboard signs, and noted public safety was a concern.

Councillor Seguin then spoke questioning fascia signs and reverse graphic fascia signs, Jim spoke in response noting that fascia signs are on the front of a building and are different than pylon signs. Jim noted that pylon signs include a number of signs on one sign. Jim noted he will speak with the Planning Department about fascia signs.

Mayor McKean then spoke questioning if the by-law could include a level of lighting, or the intensity of the light permitted, and questioned if there is a tool that would measure light.

Stephen Mazur, of Severn, Ontario spoke noting he represents Pattison LP, and confirmed they are taxpayers in The Blue Mountains. Stephen noted that Pattison is concerned with the inclusion of "alteration" of signs, further noting that the by-law should indicate that "similar" should be used when making changes to signs as it is difficult to get the exact material when changing signs.

Stephen Mazur then questioned reference to "prohibited signs", page 21 and questioned who regulates what, further noting that Highway 26 is regulated by MTO, further referencing third party permission.

Stephen Mazur then spoke regarding non-conforming signs and reference that a sign that accesses the street is non-conforming, further noting the by-law should not include "replace". Stephen noted that size or structure does not refer to change of copy or normal maintenance. Stephen noted it is impossible to lose the location of a sign as part of section 5.2, and expressed concern with section 5.3 of the by-law questioning who makes the determination of the 50% damage or deterioration. Stephen noted that it is unreasonable for the CBO to have this power, further noting it should be in consultation.

Stephen then expressed concern with section 7.10(2) regarding the removal of illegal signs that are deemed to be potentially dangerous or hazardous to the public, further noting that the CBO or by-law officer should not have this authority.

Stephen then noted that Pattison requires more time to provide their submissions in response to the draft sign by-law.

Mayor McKean spoke in response noting that the CBO has a responsibility to ensure the safety of the public.

Brian Nelson, resident at 40 Napier Street West, Thornbury spoke on behalf of the Blue Mountain Ratepayers Association ("BMRA") and noted that BMRA have submitted comments in response to the draft by-law.

Rosemary Gosselin resident on Napier Street Thornbury spoke thanking the Sign By-law Review Committee for their work, further noting the Committee has prepared a reasonable document. Rosemary thanked Bob Waind and Jim Dymont for the public consultation opportunities, further noting that she applauds the draft sign by-law. Rosemary noted that Council should permit signs that are in keeping with the area, further noting that variances set precedents. Rosemary noted that companies can adopt to our by-laws, further noting that a design committee be created.

Rosemary noted that the public wants timely transparent public consultation process, and want to be involved in major decisions that affect the public. Rosemary noted that the public want the heritage of the area preserved.

**B.2 Deputation: Dr. Hazel Lynn, Medical Officer of Health
Re: Public Health Highlights in The Blue Mountains**

Dr. Hazel Lynn spoke noting she is retiring from the Grey Bruce Health Unit, and noted that The Blue Mountains has always been supportive of the Health Unit. Dr. Lynn noted that the second hand smoke initiative was her first initiative with the Health Unit.

Dr. Lynn referenced The Blue Mountains Sustainable Path, and noted this is a great document. Dr. Lynn commended The Blue Mountains' involvement with youth in the community and noted this involvement is impressive. Dr. Lynn spoke regarding the Beaver Valley Outreach noting that this is a great organization that The Blue Mountains should be proud of that provides support to those that have less than others.

Mayor McKean thanked Dr. Lynn for her work with the Health Unit over the years, and wished her well in her future endeavors.

**B.3 Deputation: Georgian Bay Youth Roots – Melri Wright
Re: Beaver Crawl Triathlon**

Melri Wright spoke regarding the upcoming Beaver Crawl Triathlon. MJ Wright, long-time supporter of the event spoke noting this event is driven by the Georgian Bay Youth Roots. Melri noted that the triathlon is a non-traditional triathlon, in that up to four people can participate in the event per team. Melri noted that a variety of prizes are offered, and that eight students are planning the triathlon this year.

Melri then thanked Council for the financial support to assist with the costs to send 13 Beaver Valley Community School students to the recent Youth Summit.

MJ noted that the 2015 triathlon had 60 participants with 26 volunteers, and that the proceeds of \$1525 were donated to the breakfast and lunch program at GBSS. MJ noted that the event is held on Friday, July 1, Canada Day, and that it will be completed before the Canada Day Parade starts.

Melri asked Council to participate or volunteer in this year's Beaver Crawl, and thanked Council for supporting the event.

Mayor McKean then spoke thanking Melri and MJ for their deputation and wished them well in the upcoming Beaver Crawl event.

**B.4 Deputation: Georgian Bay Youth Roots – Melri Wright
Re: Youth Friendly Designation**

Jason Wepler of the Grey Bruce Health Unit spoke noting the Health Unit is looking to support youth in both Grey and Bruce Counties, and noted the Health Unit is committed to supporting municipalities in achieving the "Youth Friendly Designation".

Jason spoke regarding the criteria and application, further noting that PLAY plays a strong role in this, and that full community support is required to achieve the criteria.

Mayor McKean spoke questioning if staff will bring forward a staff report on the requirements and criteria. Director of Community Services Shawn Everitt spoke replying yes, he will bring forward a staff report to a future Committee of the Whole meeting.

B.5 Deputation: Darko Naumovski
Re: Request to Provide Full Services to Drake's Path

Darko Naumovski spoke noting he is resident on Drake's Path, and noted his deputation is further to his correspondence of April 29, 2016 requesting full services on Drake's Path. Darko provided the location of Drake's Path, and noted that adjoining streets have full services. Darko noted that there are more full time residents on Drake's Path now, and asked that Council consider his request. Darko noted that Drake's Path is approximately 1000' in length, is a dead end street, and requires paving and culverts.

Councillor Halos spoke thanking Darko for his comments, and questioned if other residents along Drake's Path are supportive of this. Darko spoke in response noting that yes, a majority of owners are in support of this request. Darko noted that there are a combination of older and newer private systems in place, but that the majority are older private systems.

Councillor Halos questioned if Drake's Path is proposed to be improved, Director of Infrastructure and Public Works Reg Russwurm spoke in response noting that Drake's Path is not within the five year plan, further noting that minor road maintenance is performed on Drake's Path, but is nothing of any significance at this time. Reg then noted that this request could be included in the 2017 or 2018 budget for Council consideration. Reg noted that residents must be aware that they will bear most of the costs, further noting this would be a small project.

Deputy Mayor Ardiel spoke questioning if 100% of the residents on Drake's Path are in support of the project, Darko spoke in response noting that it is unlikely that there will be 100% support for the project, but that a majority of the residents are supportive. Darko noted that full services would increase the property values.

Councillor Martin spoke questioning if the request is for full services including sewers and paving the street, Darko spoke in response noting that currently Drake's Path has water services, no sewer and is a gravel road. Darko noted that the culverts on the west side of the street need regraded. Reg spoke regarding the algae growing in the ditches and noted this is a drainage issue that will be forwarded to Jim McCannell, Manager of Roads and Drainage to rectify. Reg noted this request requires a long term solution that includes installing sewers and fixing the roads, and not having to do any further work on the road for 20 years.

Councillor Seguin questioned if any upgrades are required to the water servicing on Drake's Path as the water servicing was installed in 1992. Reg spoke in response noting that no, no upgrades are required to the water servicing, and noted that the road is a rural road standard.

Councillor Gamble spoke questioning if Council could be provided with a preliminary report on the potential estimated costs, including a Public Information Centre to determine if the residents on Drake's Path are interested in proceeding or not.

Mayor McKean spoke questioning if a preliminary costing could be provided, Reg replying that we are getting close to budget time for the 2017 year, further noting that residents could provide their comments during the budget process.

Councillor Gamble then spoke noting Drake's Path is a gravel road and questioned if the gravel road could be improved to a paved road as a local improvement. Director of Finance and IT Services Ruth Prince spoke in response noting she would have to review this to determine if all costs could be attributed to the residents.
