D. Deputations / Presentations / Public Meeting

D.1 Tom Strnad, Re: Patricia Drive Action Plan

Tom spoke regarding the flooding on Patricia Drive, noting that the drainage is failing on Patricia Drive. Tom noted that the flooding will not wait for a study to be completed, further noting that the flooding floods the streets and homes. Tom noted that he has been capturing what happens throughout the year, and noted that the water sits in the ditch in the winter and does not move. Tom noted that the culverts are higher than the lowest point in the ditch.

Tom requested that regular maintenance of the drainage on Patricia Drive be performed to help the failing system and allow the flow to move. Tom noted that the ditches need a back slope to prevent flooding into the front yards, and that standing water should be pumped from the ditches to prevent the annual spring flood.

Tom asked that in 2017 a drainage study be completed, and that the Town make a public statement about their commitment to build a drainage system on Patricia Drive.

Tom noted that residents are seeing insurance rates rising, because of insurance claims resulting from the failing infrastructure.

Tom noted that the current situation is not acceptable.

D.2 Candis McDonnell, Re: Permission for Business Sign

Candis spoke noting she is the owner of 45 Bruce Street which is at the corner of Louisa Street and Bruce Street. Candis noted that she is before Council this evening to request that her proposed sign placement be approved. Candis noted that it is not possible to place a sign on the building as it is a very windy corner. Candis noted that she has spoken with the Remax building owner.

Councillor Halos spoke thanking Candis for her deputation and questioned if a fascia sign could be installed on the side of the building. Candis noted that the sign would not be visible from some locations in the Town, further noting that the requested location is the most visual place for a sign.

Councillor McGee questioned if the banners block the view of her sign, and questioned if the banners could be moved further up the street, Shawn Everitt, Director of Community Services spoke in response noting yes the banners could be moved further up the street. Councillor McGee noted that this building could have signs on each side of the building.

Councillor Martin then questioned if the banners were removed, would Candis consider the placement of the sign on the side of the building. Candis spoke in response noting that no, she would like to place the sign in the location she requested.
