A. Recommendations

THAT Council does receive Staff Report FIS.09.39, "Fire False Alarm Fees and Charges" for information purposes;

AND THAT a Public Meeting to review proposed Amendments to By-law 2008-113 "Fees & Charges By-law", Schedule "D" – Fire Department Services, be held October 14, 2009.

B. Background

The current False Alarm Fee is \$300.00 for Non-emergency activation of a fire alarm system resulting in Fire Department response. This fee includes (but is not limited to) malicious activation, accidental discharge of nuisance smoke into common areas, system malfunctions, non-notification of work on system, poor maintenance, human error, etc.

The Fire Prevention/Public Education Department is actively promoting smoke alarm installation/maintenance and escape planning for both commercial and residential properties. Occupants are trained that when an early warning alarm is activated, they are to leave the building and call 911. Commercial properties are complying with Fire Code and Fire Department direction regarding fire system installation and maintenance relevant to their property. The Prevention Department is closely monitoring requirements for annual fire alarm testing, and requesting immediate repairs to deficiencies as noted on test reports. The majority of properties are prompt in complying. Occasional malfunctions within these systems are beyond the owner's control and the current fee structure of \$300 per false alarm is straining working relationships between building owners and the Fire Prevention Department.

Staff is proposing to change the term "false alarm" to "non-emergency activation of a fire alarm/early warning system". Fire alarm refers to monitored systems required by the Ontario Building Code in commercial buildings and early warning refers to monitored security systems in dwelling units.

The proposed changes to Schedule "D" of By-law 2008-113 "Fees & Charges By-law" are as follows:

- 1st occurrence - no charge (in a 12 month period)
- 2nd occurrence - \$300 fee - \$200 refunded if proof of repairs or a solution to the identified problem is provided (in a 12 month period)
- 3rd occurrence - \$300 fee (in a 12 month period)
- 4th and subsequent occurrence - \$450 fee (in a 12 month period)

The change to false alarms fees will become effective at the time of the passing of the By-law.

Letters will be issued to owners by the Fire Prevention Department identifying each occurrence and further action, should any be required.

The proposed changes will ensure residential and commercial owners are aware of potential problems with their fire alarm/early warning systems through communication with the Fire Prevention Officer. This will provide the Fire Prevention Officer an opportunity to mitigate a potential problem with a system in the early stages, ensure that the system is installed and/or repaired in accordance with applicable Codes and Standards and ensure that the system operation and supervisory procedures will provide adequate life safety for all building occupants in the event of a fire.

The proposed changes will help to promote and maintain co-operative working relationships between owners and the Fire Prevention Department.

The revenue received from False Alarm charges to the end of August is \$8,150. (2009 Budget \$5,000) The 2010 budget will reflect the change in fees and charges revenue from False Alarms.

BY-LAW NO. 2009 -

BEING A BY-LAW TO AMEND BY-LAW 2008-113, BEING A BY-LAW FOR THE IMPOSITION AND COLLECTION OF FEES AND CHARGES FOR CERTAIN MUNICIPAL SERVICES AND ACTIVITIES

WHEREAS in accordance with Sections 391 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S.O. 2001, c. 25, *Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. M.56 as amended, the Council of The Corporation of the Town of The Blue Mountains considers it necessary to impose fees for services rendered under these Acts;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the Town of The Blue Mountains has enacted By-law 2008-113 respecting Fees & Charges;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the Town of The Blue Mountains deems it necessary and expedient to amend By-law No. 2008-113 respecting Fees and Charges related to Fire Department Services;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the Town of The Blue Mountains hereby enacts as follows:

1. THAT Schedule "D" of By-law 2008-113 be amended as per Schedule "D" attached hereto which is hereby declared to form part of By-law 2008-113, effective upon the enactment of this By-law.
2. THAT Schedule "H" of By-law 2008-113 be amended as per Schedule "H" attached hereto which is hereby declared to form part of By-law 2008-113, effective January 1, 2010.
3. THAT Schedule "I" of By-law 2008-113 be amended as per Schedule "I" attached hereto which is hereby declared to form part of By-law 2008-113, effective January 1, 2010.
4. THAT Schedule "J" attached hereto are hereby adopted and declared to form part of By-law 2008-113, effective January 1, 2010.
5. THAT Schedule "K" attached hereto are hereby adopted and declared to form part of By-law 2008-113, effective September 1, 2009.

AND FURTHER, THAT this By-law shall come into force and take effect upon the enactment thereof.

Note #1 For the Emergency Response Services, Collingwood, Meaford and Wasaga Beach have on charge per hour that includes both labour and machine time. It is therefore hard to compare these services.
