Council Presentation

Introduction

Your worship and members of Council, thank you for the opportunity to present to you information and a request from the Dufferin Grey ATV Club Inc.

This presentation has been given to the Towns of Blue Mountain, and will be given again to Meaford Township as soon as we can be accommodated by the respective Councils.

Our club was incorporated as a not-for-profit club on December 19, 2006. At that time we joined with then a club known as Centre Grey ATV Club, chapter club of Central Ontario ATV Club. We now have 280 members in our club and over 400 km of trails within Grey and Dufferin County. The Municipality of West Grey has a club known as West Grey ATV Club that are affiliated with the Eastern Ontario Trails Alliance. We are with the Ontario Federation of All Terrain Vehicles.

The OFATV membership and permit fee support the development of a safe ATV trail network, the promotion of safe practices, and the protection of the environment. The OFATV ensures that proper insurance coverage applies to all OFATV designated trails in Ontario. The OFATV holds total 3rd party liability insurance of \$5 million.

ATV Growth

According to the Canadian Off Highway Vehicle Distributors Council January 30, 2007 press release there are over one million ATV's in Canada and that number was expected to grow. Over 975,000 of those machines are used primarily for recreational purposes.

The numbers are still growing and some are right in your back yard.

By-Law

The Highway Traffic Act R.S.O. 1990, Section 191.8 subsection (3) chapter 11.8 as amended provides that the council of a Municipality may pass a by-law permitting the operation of off road vehicles. Specifications are outlined in the Act.

Several municipalities in Ontario have done so and most notably in our area the Township of Melancthon in Dufferin. In Grey county Bylaws have been passed within Southgate, West Grey,

Grey Highlands, Georgian Bluff and Chatsworth, along with trails marked to encourage safe environmentally friendly riding encouraging Tourism.

We have provided you with copies of the bylaws within a few of the Municipalities within Grey County for you to refer back to.

Building Approved Trails

Our club is working with the local snowmobile club to "link up" with as many of their trails as possible, including the CP rail trail from Sunny Valley Road in Meaford Township to Orangeville in Dufferin County. In addition our club will strive to incorporate local business; gas stations, restaurants and accommodations, on the trail network.

Our club will have land owner agreements with private land owners and our affiliation with the OFATV protects each land owner with third-party liability insurance. The OFATV provides a Warden Program that trains and identifies the Wardens that will patrol any trail or connecting road way to ensure compliance with the rules. Our Wardens will work in conjunction with the local police to enforce the by-law.

Within Blue Mountains, we are all aware that ATV's are being ridden. In fact they are doing it illegally and annoying some residents. By approving our request you will be putting guidelines in place to provide comfort for your residents. In addition you will have help from the Dufferin Grey ATV Club Inc. in patrolling the areas so we can promote our goal of this safe, responsible, environmentally sound family activity.

Safe and Responsible Riding

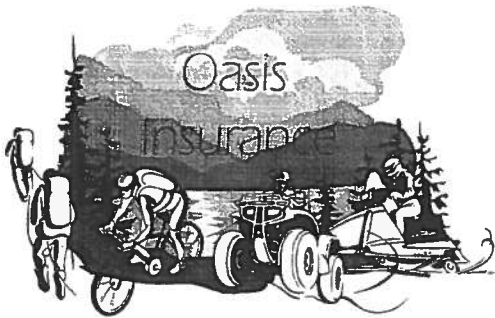
- Promotion of safe riding via education and marked trails

**THE CORPORATION OF THE
Township of Chatsworth
BY -LAW No. 2004-20**

Being a by-law to regulate and control the movement and time of movement of "ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES" also known as A.T.V.(s) on any highways or road allowance's under the control of the Township of Chatsworth.

WHEREAS the Municipal Act 2001, Section 8, the powers of natural person exercise of authority and section 11(1) spheres of jurisdiction;

AND WHEREAS the operation and requirements for all terrain vehicles is defined in Ontario Regulation 316/03 as amended;

AND WHEREAS the Highway Traffic Act R.S.O. 1990, Section 191.8, subsection (3), Chapter H.8, as amended, provides that the Council of a Municipality may pass by-laws;

- a) permitting the operation of all terrain vehicles, as defined in Ontario Regulation 316/03 and amendments thereto on any part or parts of highways under the jurisdiction of a local Municipality;
- b) providing for a lower rate of speed for off road vehicles by regulation on any highway, or any part or parts of such highway within the Municipality that is under it's jurisdiction;
- c) providing for the time of operation restrictions of off road vehicles on any highway, or part or parts of such highway within the Municipality that is under it's jurisdiction;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Chatsworth hereby enacts as follows:

DEFINITIONS

- (1) Highways includes a common and public highway, street, avenue, parkway, square, place, drive, bridge, viaduct or trestle, any part which is intended for or used by the general public for the passing of vehicles and includes the area between the lateral property lines thereof.
- (2) In this by-law an all-terrain vehicle, (ATV), means an off road vehicle that:
 - (a) is defined by Ontario Regulation 316/03 and amendments thereto.
 - (b) Has regulation headlights and regulation tail lights that must be on at all times.
 - (c) Has operating regulation brake light.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

- (1) No person shall operate an ATV in any park that is under the jurisdiction of the Council of the Township of Chatsworth.
- (2) Schedule "B" list person(s) or groups or organizations exempt from this by-law.
- (3) No person shall operate an all terrain vehicle that does not have regulation headlights and regulation tail lights that must be on at all times
- (4) No person shall operate an all terrain vehicle that does not have regulation brake lights.
- (5) No person shall operate an all terrain vehicle within the Township of Chatsworth between the hours of 11:00 pm. to 5:00 a.m. on any day.
- (6) All terrain vehicles are prohibited on the roads listed on Schedule "A" attached hereto.
- (7) For the purposes of this by-law, unopened and open, maintained road allowances of the Township of Chatsworth will be used as part of the Georgian Trail Riders, Centre Grey Chapter ATV association trail system, except for those road allowances set out in Schedule "A" attached hereto.


- (8) Any person(s) who contravenes any of the provisions of this By-Law is guilty of an offense and upon conviction is liable to a fine as provide for under the Highway Traffic Act and the Compulsory Automobile Insurance Act and the Provincial Offences Act.

This by-law shall come into effect after third and final reading has been given by Council of the Township of Chatsworth.



BY-LAW NUMBER 2004-23

Being a by-law to permit and regulate All-Terrain Vehicles (ATV) on municipal roads with the exception of those roads listed on Schedule "A" attached hereto

WHEREAS, The Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1990, Section 191.8, Subsection (3) and (4), Chapter H.8, as amended, provides that the Council of a municipality may pass by-laws;

- (3) (a) Permitting the operation of off-road vehicles with three or more wheels and low pressure bearing tires on any highway within the municipality that is under the jurisdiction of the municipality or on any part or parts of such highways;
- (b) Prescribing a lower rate of speed for off-road vehicles by regulation on any highway within the municipality that is under its jurisdiction, or any part or parts of such highway;
- (4) Providing for the time of operation restrictions of off road vehicles on any highway, or part or parts of such highway within the municipality that is under it's jurisdiction;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of Grey Highlands enacts as follows:

I. DEFINITIONS

In this by-law,

"All-Terrain Vehicle" means an off-road vehicle that:

- i) has four wheels, the tires of all of which are in contact with the ground,
- ii) has steering handlebars,
- iii) has a seat that is designed to be straddled by the driver, and
- iv) is designed to carry a driver only and no passengers.

"Low Pressure Bearing Tires: means a wide, balloon-type tire with a rounded cross section and no distinct shoulder area and that is designed to operate with inflation pressure of no greater than 70KPA (10psi).

"Off-Road Vehicle" means an off-road vehicle within the meaning of the Off-Road Vehicles Act.

II. GENERAL PROVISIONS AND REGULATION OF ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES ON HIGHWAYS:

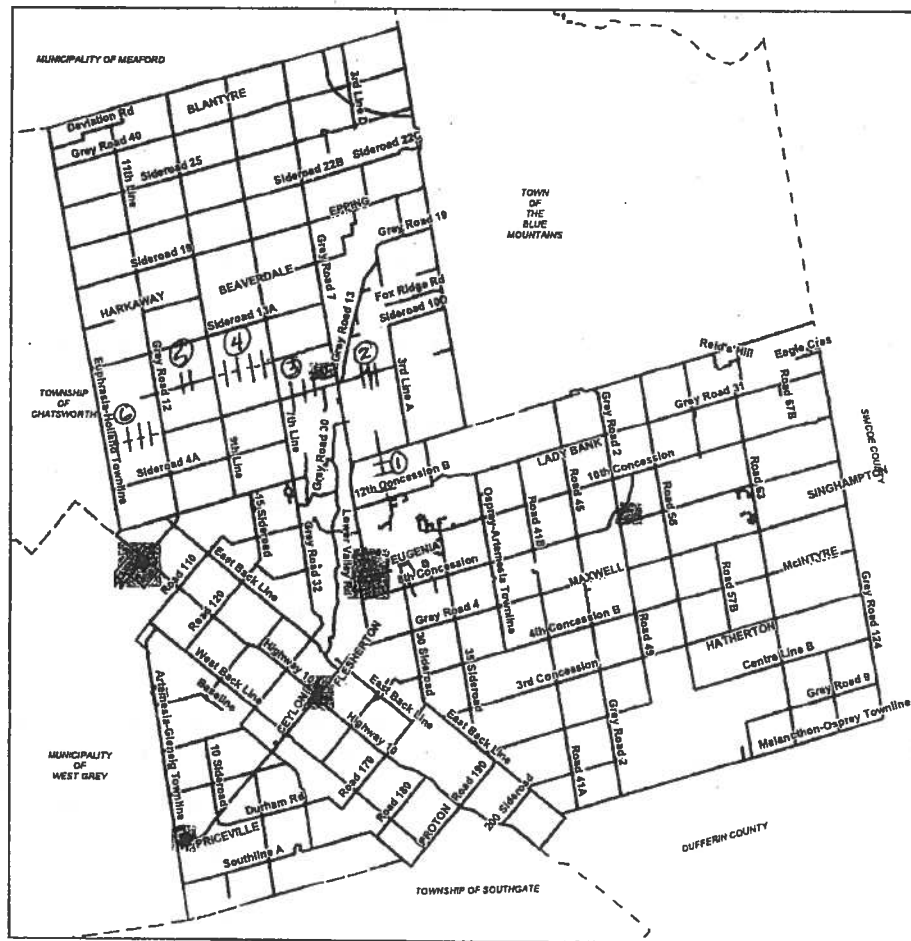
1. An All-Terrain Vehicle shall not be operated on highways unless it meets the equipment requirements of Section 7 to 15 of O.Reg. 316/03 and it is operated in accordance with Sections 16 to 24 of O. Reg. 316/03 made under the Highway Traffic Act.
2. Off-Road Vehicles with four wheels and low pressure bearing tires shall be permitted on all municipal roads within the Municipality of Grey Highlands, with the exception of those roads listed on Schedule "A" attached hereto, under and in accordance with Ontario Regulation 316/03 made under the Highway Traffic Act and the Off Roads Vehicles Act as amended.
3. No person shall operate an all terrain vehicle within the Municipality of Grey Highlands between the hours of 11:00 p.m to 5:00 a.m. on any day.
4. All terrain vehicles are prohibited on the roads listed on Schedule "A" attached hereto.





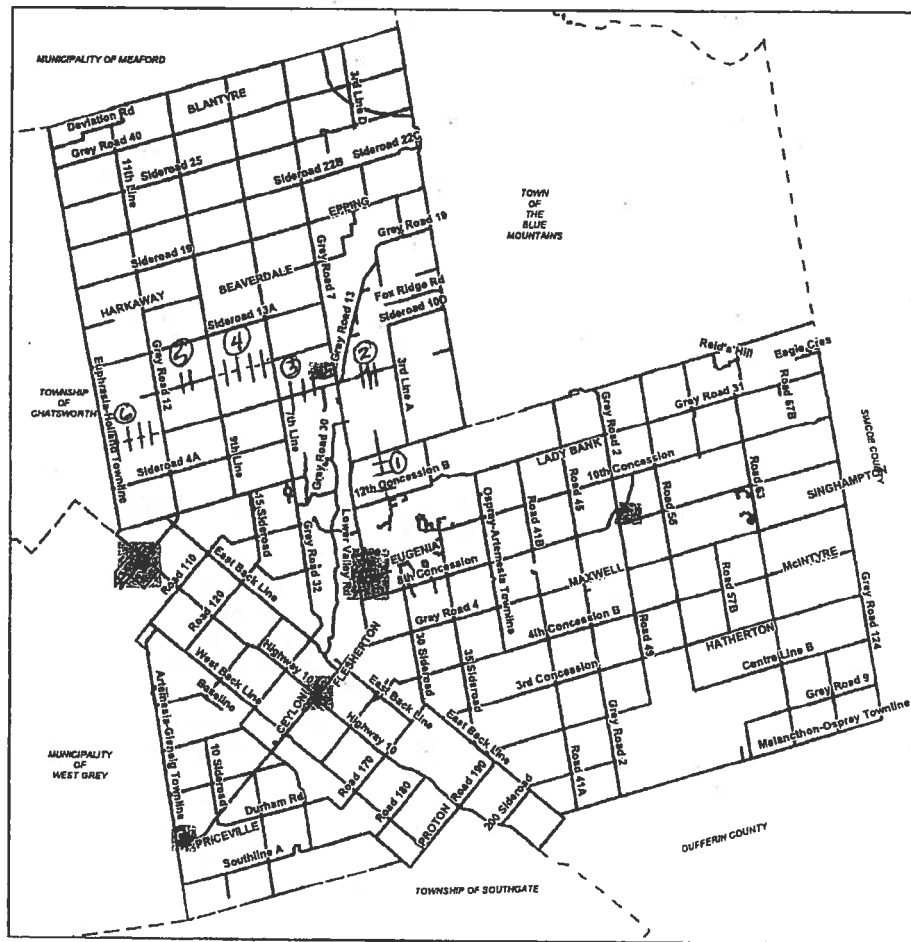

3. No person shall operate an all terrain vehicle within the Municipality of Grey Highlands between the hours of 11:00 p.m to 5:00 a.m. on any day.
4. All terrain vehicles are prohibited on the roads listed on Schedule "A" attached hereto.

BY-LAW NO. 4673-10

**A BY-LAW TO PERMIT THE OPERATION OF ALL TERRAIN
VEHICLES ON CERTAIN SECTIONS OF GREY COUNTY ROADS 4, 12
AND 13 IN THE COUNTY OF GREY ANNUALLY FROM
MAY 1 TO NOVEMBER 30
(as amended by By-Law 4682-10, 4721-11 and 4770-12)**

WHEREAS the Council of the County of Grey adopted the recommendation of the Transportation and Public Safety Committee at its May 6, 2010 meeting approving the operation of All Terrain Vehicles on certain sections of Grey County Roads 4, 12 and 13 as specified in Schedule "A";

AND WHEREAS Section 8 of The *Municipal Act 2001*, as amended provides that a municipality has the authority to govern its affairs as it considers appropriate and enables the municipality to respond to municipal issues;

AND WHEREAS section 191.8, Subsection (3) and (4) of the *Highway Traffic Act* R.S.O. 1990, Chapter H. 8, as amended, provides that a Council of a municipality may pass by-laws respecting off-road vehicles;

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE COUNTY OF GREY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1 In this By-Law:

- (a) "All terrain Vehicle" means an Off-Road Vehicle that:
 - (i) has four wheels, all of the tires of which are in contact with the ground,
 - (ii) has steering handlebars,
 - (iii) has a seat that is designed to be straddled by the driver,
 - (iv) has Low Pressure Bearing Tires, and
 - (v) is designed to carry a driver only and no passengers.
- (b) "Fine" means a fine imposed for violating a provision of this by-law in the amount as set out in Schedule "B" of this By-Law.
- (c) "Highway" means a common and public highway, street, road, avenue, laneway or bridge, which is actually being used by the general public for the passage of vehicles and is under the jurisdiction of the County of Grey and includes the area between the lateral property lines thereof.
- (d) "Low Pressure Bearing Tires" means a wide, balloon-type tire with a rounded cross section and no distinct shoulder area and that is designated to operate with inflation pressure of no greater than 70KPA (10psi)

(e) "Off-Road Vehicle" means an off-road vehicle with the meaning of the *Off-Road Vehicles Act*, R.S.O. 1990.

2. Subject to the other sections of this By-law, All-terrain Vehicles are permitted to be operated on the traveled portion, including the shoulder, of the Highways described in Schedule A. All-Terrain Vehicles shall not be permitted on any other Highway or part of a Highway.
3. An All-terrain Vehicle shall not be operated on any Highway unless it meets the equipment requirements of Section 7 to 15 of Ontario Regulations 316/03 and it is operated in accordance with Sections 16 to 24 of Ontario Regulations 316/03, S. 6.
4. No person shall drive an All-terrain Vehicle at a rate of speed exceeding the rate of speed determined by subtracting 30 kilometres per hour from the posted speed limit on the Highway.
5. No person shall operate an All-terrain Vehicle on any Highway between the hours of 9:30 p.m. and 7:00 a.m.
6. No person shall operate an All-terrain Vehicle on a Highway between November 30 and May 1 of each year except those being used for snow removal. All-terrain Vehicles being used for snow removal must be equipped with a plow and visible intermittent flashing amber light.
7. No person shall interfere or obstruct an officer carrying out his/her duties enforcing this By-law.
8. Every person who contravenes any provision of this By-Law is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to a Fine as provided for by the Provincial Offences Act, R.S. O. Chapter P.33.
9. The Warden and County Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute, and the Clerk to affix the Corporate seal thereto, an Agreement between the Corporation of the County of Grey and the Dufferin Grey ATV Club regarding All-terrain Vehicles
10. The Agreement referred to in Clause 9 is attached hereto and forms and is a part of this By-law.
11. This By-law shall come into full force and effect upon the date of final passing thereof.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

As a condition of the Corporation of the County of Grey (the "County") permitting, the use of off-road vehicles on those parts of the highways under its jurisdiction described below:

_____ all as depicted on the attachment (the "Permitted Highways") pursuant to By-law _____ passed under authority of section 191.8 of the *Highway Traffic Act*, the Dufferin Grey ATV Club Inc. (the "ATV Club") agrees with the County as follows:

- I. The ATV Club shall cause a risk management assessment to be completed by qualified persons from the Ontario Federation of All Terrain Vehicles ("OFATV") and the recommendations of the OFATV report shall be implemented by the ATV Club to the satisfaction of the County's Transportation and Public Safety Committee ("TAPS") prior to opening any part of the Permitted Highways for off-road vehicle use.
2. The ATV Club shall pay that proportion of the costs associated with the necessary repairs and upgrades to the shoulders of the Permitted Highways requested by TAPS to permit off-road vehicle use.
3. The ATV Club shall maintain that portion of the Permitted Highways that is exclusively used by off-road vehicles in good condition for that purpose; and undertakes to post appropriate signage; remove on an annual basis any litter caused by off-road vehicles and their riders; and repair or replace property damaged by off-road vehicles and their riders on that portion of Permitted Highways.
4. The ATV Club shall, as soon as possible, repair any damage caused by off-road vehicles to the Permitted Highways to the satisfaction of TAPS.
4. The ATV Club shall obtain and maintain third party liability insurance providing coverage to the satisfaction of the County for risks of injury to persons (including death) and damage to property as a result of use of the Permitted Highways for off-road vehicle traffic naming the County as an additional insured, providing liability coverage of limits of not less than \$5 million per incident.
5. Any claims arising directly or indirectly from the use of the Permitted Highways including claims alleging negligence on the part of the County, except where the County is found to be solely negligent will be the responsibility of the ATV Club. The ATV Club shall indemnify and save harmless the County, its agents, contractors, employees, servants, licensees, concessionaires or invitees from any and all liabilities, fines, suits, claims, demands, costs and actions of any kind or nature whatsoever arising out of any injury to any person or persons (including death) and/or damage to property and/or equipment resulting from the use of the Permitted Highways by off-road vehicles. In the event the County is made a party to any litigation commenced by or against the ATV Club, the ATV Club shall defend and hold the County harmless from and shall pay all costs, expenses, and legal fees incurred. Such indemnification is in respect of all

liabilities, fines, suits, claims, demands, costs, and actions of any kind or nature whatsoever to which the County might otherwise be liable for in that regard except where the County is found to be solely negligent.

6. The ATV Club hereby releases the County from all liabilities, fines, suits, claims, demands, costs and actions of any kind or nature whatsoever with respect to the use and operation of Permitted Highways.

7. Each party hereto shall give the other thirty (30) days prior written notice to the address below of any proposed changes to or cancellation of this agreement at the address for service as follows:

THE CORPORATION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF WEST GREY
BY-LAW NUMBER 17 – 2009

Being a by-law to permit and regulate All-Terrain Vehicles (ATV) on municipally maintained highways as set out on Schedule "A" attached hereto.

WHEREAS, The Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1990, Section 191.8, Subsection (3) and (4), Chapter H.8, as amended, provides that the Council of a municipality may pass by-laws respecting off-road vehicles;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of West Grey enacts as follows:

I. DEFINITIONS

In this by-law,

"All-Terrain Vehicle" means an off-road vehicle that:

- i) has four wheels, the tires of all of which are in contact with the ground,
- ii) has steering handlebars,
- iii) has a seat that is designed to be straddled by the driver, and
- iv) is designed to carry a driver only and no passengers.

"Fines" means fines imposed for violating this by-law and attached as Schedule "C" of this by-law.

"Low Pressure Bearing Tires" means a wide, balloon-type tire with a rounded cross section and no distinct shoulder area and that is designed to operate with inflation pressure of no greater than 70KPA (10psi).

"Highway" includes a common and public highway, street, avenue, parkway, driveway, square, place, bridge, viaduct or trestle, any part of which is intended for or used by the general public for the passage of vehicles and includes the traveled portion of the roadway and shoulders only.

II. GENERAL PROVISION AND REGULATION OF ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES ON HIGHWAYS:

1. An All-Terrain Vehicle shall not be operated on municipally maintained highways unless it meets the equipment requirements of Section 7 to 15 of O.Reg. 316/03 and it is operated in accordance with Sections 16 to 24 of O.Reg. 316/03 made under the Highway Traffic Act.
2. All-Terrain Vehicles with four wheels and low pressure bearing tires shall be permitted on municipally maintained roads within the Municipality of West Grey except those listed on Schedule "A" attached hereto, under and in accordance with Ontario Regulation 316/03 made under the Highway Traffic Act and the Off Roads Vehicles Act as amended.
3. All-Terrain Vehicles may only be operated within the Municipality of West Grey between March 1 and December 15 of each year except those used for snow removal. All Terrain Vehicles used for snow removal must be equipped with a plow and a visible intermittent flashing amber light.
4. No person shall operate an All-Terrain Vehicle within the Municipality of West Grey between the hours of 9:00 P.M. and 5:00 A.M.
5. No person shall operate an All-Terrain Vehicle at a speed greater than 30 kilometres per hour below the posted speed limit.
6. No person shall operate an All-Terrain Vehicle on municipally owned

property, including but not limited to, community centres, parks, playgrounds, and beaches, save and except for permitted municipally maintained highways.

7. No person shall operate an All-Terrain Vehicle near a church or funeral home when services are in progress.

8. Schedule "B" lists person(s) or groups or organizations exempt from this bylaw.

9. No person shall interfere or obstruct an officer carrying out his/her duties enforcing this by-law.

10. Every person who contravenes any provision of this By-law is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to a fine as provided for by the Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O. Chapter P.33.

11. Council shall review this by-law annually at the first Council meeting in December.

12. The Provisions of this by-law shall come into force and take effect on the final passing hereof.

SCHEDULE "B" TO BY-LAW NUMBER 17 - 2009

EXEMPTIONS

The following are exempt from By-law Number 17 - 2009 :

1. All Police Officers while performing his or her duties.
2. All Fire Department personnel while performing his or her duties.
3. All Medical Rescue personnel while performing his or her duties.
4. All employees of the Municipality of West Grey while performing their duties.
5. Hydro One employee(s) and its' contractors while performing his or her duties.
6. Ministry of Natural Resources employees while performing his or her duties.
7. Farmer(s), Trappers(s), and Public Utility Worker(s) and type of vehicle are exempt, while performing his/her duties.
8. County of Grey By-Law Enforcement personnel while performing his or her duties.
9. Any person(s) or group that has written permission from the Council of the Municipality of West Grey to operate A.T.V.'s in prohibited areas.
