A. Recommendations

THAT Council receive Staff Report DOR.11.57 entitled “Cedar Run Horse Park Rodeo Event Noise By Law Exemption”; and,

THAT Council authorize relief from the Town’s Noise By Law 2002-09 to Cedar Run Horse Park to permit Rodeo Event Activities at the Cedar Run Horse Park through allowing an exemption on August 27th from 10a.m. to 1a.m. and August 28th from 10a.m. to 6p.m.

B. Background

Cedar Run Horse Park is located on Clark Street just west of the OPP Station and Fire Hall. The Horse Park runs numerous events throughout the year, with their signature event being the “Rawhide Rodeo”.

The “Rawhide Rodeo” is scheduled to happen throughout the weekend of August 27th and 28th. The rodeo is expected to draw over 5000 people, but not to exceed 10,000. The rodeo is to take place on their main sand ring and will happen once on Saturday (5pm to 7pm) and once on Sunday (2pm to 4pm). The rodeo will include voice broadcasting and back up music over an amplified system.

Along with the Rodeo, there will be live entertainment and festival attractions happening on the grounds during the weekend. These will be happening during the times before and after the rodeo. The live entertainment will commence on Saturday August 27th at 1pm and will continue until 1am, and on Sunday August 28th from 1pm until 6pm. Some complaints have been received from previous events from neighbours and other community members about the noise level coming from Cedar Run. For this event Cedar Run will use a “Seinheiser” sound system that provides, clean, clear, quality sound and is designed to be used with a smaller close proximity audience and will help reduce the noise disturbance to the rest of the community.

This is the second year Cedar Run Horse Park has hosted the Rodeo. The Rodeo services are supplied by Professional Rodeo Company, “Rawhide Rodeo”. The Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario now requires as of June 1, 2011 that approvals for Special Occasion Permit applications for Public Events for an individual or business organizing or conducting an event of “municipal significance” for which a resolution is required from the municipal council.

THAT Council does hereby designate the August 27, 28, 2011 Cedar Run Rodeo Weekend as a Significant Event within the Town of The Blue Mountains, subject to approval of the organization of the event by Town Fire and Building Staff.

Based on the existing designation criteria for a Significant Event identified in the "Special Events By Law 2005-34", this event does meet the criteria for Significant Event, as it will bring people to the area.

In accordance with the LCBO's Special Occasion Permit information package, Cedar Run Horse Park would like to request a municipal resolution for the use of a Special Occasion Permit to allow the sale of alcohol at our Horse Show event, the Cedar Run Rodeo Weekend August 27-28. This will be for competitors and spectators, which are expected to number 2,000-3,000 over the course of the weekend.

The event will have a charitable partner, Camp Maple Leaf, and a portion of ticket sales and other fundraising events on-site will go to supporting their efforts – namely a camp for underprivileged children and a retreat for military families after return from deployment. We are also looking at potentially having another charitable partner participate but at this time that is not confirmed.

Competitors on the Rawhide Rodeo tour come from four countries to compete at Cedar Run. In addition, we are marketing to draw attendees in from other surrounding towns and counties to the Blue Mountains area.

The Rodeo Weekend will have staffing and volunteer opportunities for members of the local community, and we will involve the businesses in the towns of Thornbury and Clarksburg, as well as the Village, to participate as well so this Weekend builds into a community festival that brings more visitors to the area in addition to our show.

Mission Statement: "To provide a world class multidisciplinary horse park in an extraordinary, natural country setting."

Attached please find a black line drawing of the property with a black lined area indicating the area to be licensed for this event. The area will be fenced in with temporary fencing for the event. There will be a tent on the area (approximate size 40'x60') and the appropriate permits and inspections obtained/conducted from/by the Building Department and Fire Department in advance. Fire and Police safety plans and relevant application processes will be followed and approved well in advance of the event.

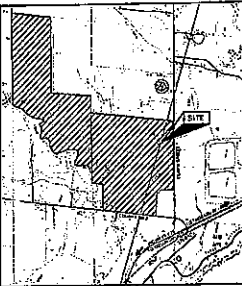

CEDAR RUN HORSE PARK

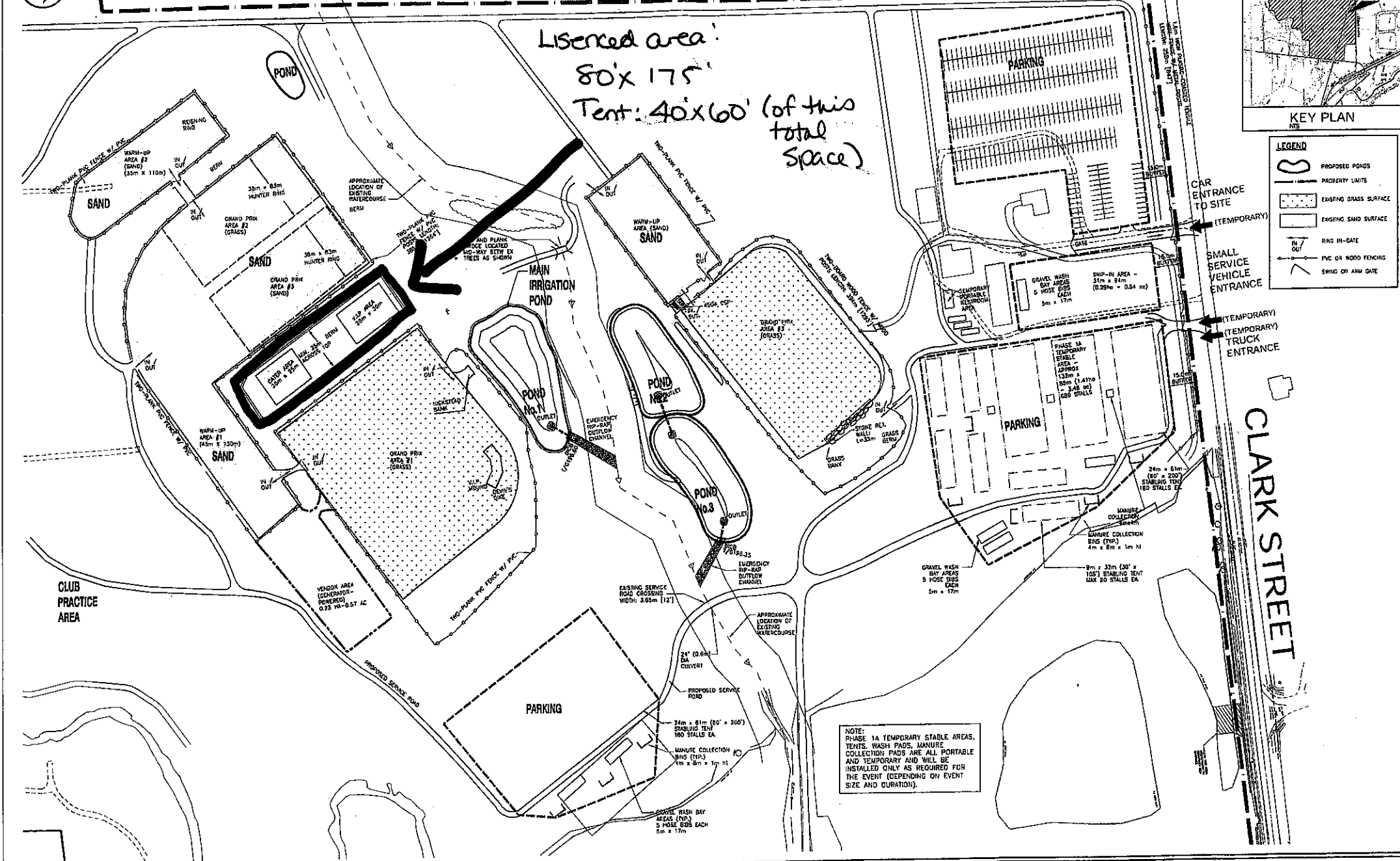
