



Charlie noted the OPP to meet and work with Craigeleith area residents regarding short term accommodation concerns .

Charlie then noted the Neighbourhood Watch program was proceeding and expanding into other areas of the municipality.

Charlie then noted he was also a witness at the recent Ontario Municipal Board Hearing regarding short term accommodation, the Hearing adjourned until January, 2011.

Charlie then noted a marine patrol was instituted at Northwinds Beach following concerns expressed that personal watercraft were being operated too close to swimmers and this would be an issue that would be monitored in 2011.

Charlie then noted there had also been ATV patrols on the Georgian Trail to address the matter of e-bikes travelling on the trail.

Charlie then noted the OPP operated the DARE program at Beaver Valley Community School and participated in a Centurion Cycle event at BVCS promoting a Bicycle Helmet Safety Program.

Charlie then reported the G8 Summit presented very little issues, with some Officers attending the G20 Summit with costs paid by the Federal government.

Charlie then reported the Centurion Cycling event appeared to run smoothly, with 46 Officers involved in a multi-jurisdictional operation over the two days.

Charlie then reported on the 2010 Wakestock event, noting it was recommended the Great Northern Exhibition grounds be retained for camping accommodation in 2011.

Inspector Trude then noted organizers attempted to book the GNE grounds for camping accommodation but were not able to meet the Clearview Events By-law requirements. John added there were 10,000 attendees on Saturday with many having not accommodation for the night and this will need to be addressed for the 2011 event.

Chair Knott then questioned if there were concerns from the Blue Mountain Village following the event, John replying the OPP are not prepared to support the event in 2011 unless attendees are provided areas for accommodation. John further noted the Events By-law will be applied in 2011, requiring parking, accommodation and other matters to be addressed.

Charlie then reviewed contract policing statistics for August and year to date, John noting for the first six months of 2010 there is a shortage of 243 hours, adding The Blue Mountains still has a full-time Federally funded Officer and these hours are not indicated in the contract statistics.

Chair Knott questioned how long the Federal funding would be in place, John replying there was no end in sight.

John then noted to date there is a \$33,000.00 credit for the first six months of the 2010 contract, adding special events such as the Centurion Cycling race utilized paid duty



Regarding D.6, Rod noted the executed RIDE grant agreement had been received from the Province.

## **E. Other Business**

Rod then reported on concerns from a Town resident while operating a truck in Clearview Township in August. The resident noted that while stopped at a four way stop intersection waiting to turn right, three cyclists in training passed him on the right and continued through the intersection without stopping.

Rod then noted general concern with cyclists involved in future race events as a Board matter and questioned if the OPP should meet with event organizers and reinforce the requirements of the Highway Traffic Act regarding cyclists.

Charlie noted he could contact the Centurion organizers prior to any 2011 event regarding responsibilities of participants in both training and events.

Rod then noted he has also observed cyclists stopping on the travelled road to view the surroundings.

Charlie then noted the Highway Traffic Act requires an overtaking vehicle to move to the left as far as is practical and the slower vehicle, whether a tractor or cyclist, must move to the right as far as is practical.

John then noted for 2011, Centurion is considering a July date, Rod replying any meeting date may have to be moved up.

Chair Knott then noted Council would have to consider a municipal appointment to the Board following the 2010 Municipal Election on October 25 and perhaps the next meeting could be moved back from December.

**COMMUNITY POLICING COMMITTEE ACTIVITY:**

The Community Policing Committee continues its efforts towards building a successful Community Watch program. A meeting was held at the Craigeith Community Hall on September 15th, which Cliff Carr and several of the Watch Coordinators attended. There was some good discussion on issues that are still occurring in that zone and some possible actions that may be taken. The CPC is continuing to expand the Neighbourhood Watch program into other areas of our municipality and launch a Business Watch and road watch programs as well.

#### **DETACHMENT COMMANDERS UPDATE:**

Sgt Watts was called by the municipality to testify at the OMB Hearing involving the use of Short Term Accommodations in The Blue Mountains. He was able to provide statistical information on the number of incidents police respond to in the Craigeith Zone and more specifically addressing STA's.

Complaints were received by the municipality about PWC's operating around swimmers at North Winds Beach. To address this issue the police boat attended the beach and officers did some proactive patrol and safety presentations. Cst McKean attended the beach area on several other occasions to look for any violations.

ATV Patrol was conducted throughout the summer on the Georgian Trail to address issues of e-bikes traveling on the trail.

#### **PUBLIC INFORMATION/SERVICE.**

Cst Rivers has begun the DARE program again at BVCS along with a Cyber Cops program (internet safety) for grade 7 students and Youth Drug Awareness for grade 8 students.

As part of the Centurion Cycle event Cst Rivers attended BVCS for a Bicycle Helmet Safety program in September. She also attended Beaver Valley Preschool in August for a talk on general safety with the children.

The Detachment Marine Unit attended Thornbury Harbour for a regatta held in August to raise funds for Cancer.

Cst Rostance along with members of the Auxiliary unit will provide a static display at the annual open house held by The Blue Mountains Fire Department on October 2nd.

#### **OPERATIONS UPDATES:**

G8 Update

The G8 Summit came and went with very few problems arising, however the G20 Summit in Toronto wasn't as smooth and some of our officers were sent to Toronto for two days.

### Centurion Bike Race

The Centurion Cycle Race took place September 18 and 19, starting and finishing in the Village at Blue Mountain. The event was multi-jurisdictional and the involved municipalities, roads departments and police from Grey County, Simcoe County, Clearview Twp, and the municipalities of Grey Highlands and The Blue Mountains. The event required 46 police officers over the two days for traffic control with all costs being covered by Centurion Cycle Canada. From a police perspective the event went smoothly.

### Wakefest

Then event activities took place again this year in Collingwood and The Village at Blue Mountain. From the feedback to police it's believed that the Village is no longer interested in having any involvement with this event. If it's to take place in Collingwood next year the event organizers will need to secure the GNE grounds for camping.
