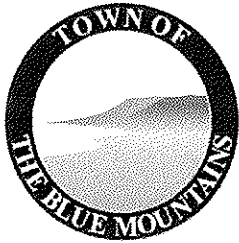

#### **A. Recommendations**

**THAT Planning & Building Services Committee receive Staff Report PL.09.132, Street Naming Policy Update, and recommend that Council include the name of "Bell" on the street naming list under the Schedule "A" – "Names Honouring Those Who Have Served Their Country".**

#### **B. Background**

On March 02, 2009, Council adopted the Town of The Blue Mountains "Street Naming Policy". As noted at the time of adoption, Town staff would report back with names that would appear to meet the criteria identified in the policy for Council's consideration. In this regard, attached is a request that is self-explanatory.

Town Staff have reviewed this request and have determined that it does not duplicate or could be confused with a street name that currently exists within the Town or County. If Council is desirous of adding the name "Bell" to the inventory of street names, Town Staff would suggest that the name "Bell" be added under the heading of "Names Honouring Those Who Have Served Their Country" and that the name be reserved for use in Thornbury.
