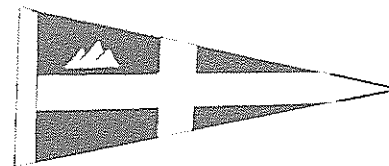

Dear Shawn,

Over the past year there has been much discussion over the future location of cradle storage for the Thornbury Yacht Club. Alan Chesworth, Doug Johnston and I along with yourself and Ryan have progressed the discussion to a point where we believe we have a feasible go forward direction in need of a specific plan and its appropriate approvals.

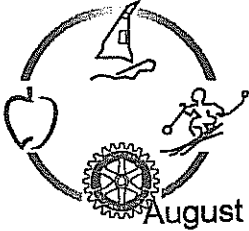
We would like to propose that we move forward with this plan expeditiously in order to ensure we are fully implemented by the spring 2010. We believe we are in agreement that the new location for TYC cradle storage will be the plot of real estate immediately adjoining the washroom building on the south east side on the harbour property. Our proposal would be that we extend a triangular shaped lot behind the building adjacent to it and extending towards the entrance road. The plot would be fenced, and could include a space for the existing town garbage dumpster. The ground would require some minor excavation and leveling with an appropriate aggregate laid down on the site. Thornbury Yacht Club proposes that the Town of the Blue Mountains be responsible for the excavation and surface finishing and the Club be responsible for the erection of a suitable privacy fence and access.

It is important that we start to move on this now, gaining all the appropriate approvals, from the town's point of view and from the yacht club's own membership with respect to the expenditures required. Land preparation needs to happen during the 2009 season so that it is settled prior to moving cradles in the spring of 2010.

Please could you let me know that you are in agreement with this direction so we can arrange a suitable meeting on this subject, specifically to develop a detail timing of commitments and activity completion dates. We will contact you in the next week to schedule a meeting time on this matter.
