Waste Collection: Christmas Day and New Year's day collection will occur the following day

Put Waste in Its Place



Items for collection must be out by 7:00 a.m.

Styrofoam Recycling
(limited to white bulky packaging foam)

No curbside collection available. Must be delivered to the Landfill and Recycling Depot.

Blue & Grey Boxes Full?

Use clear bags for the two streams, and can be placed in stationary waste boxes.

Not in the Bin!

Do not place diapers and personal hygiene products, plastic, glass, metal, Styrofoam, cigarette butts and ashes, soil, rocks, bricks, plastic bags, elastics, textiles, waxed paper, other non-compostable waste and yard waste in the green bin.

Residential Garbage Limits

First bag is free, second bag requires one tag, third bag requires two tags. Additional bags are not permitted. Bag limited to 18 kgs. Bag limited to 76 cm x 97 cm in size. Can must have side handles and is limited to 84 cm in height by 56 cm in diameter.

Garbage Bag Tags

\$5 per tag (subject to change)



SEASONAL SERVICE

Curbside Yard Waste Collection (Spring & Fall)

Maximum 10 containers or bags per week. April 21 to May 30, 2025 and October 13 to November 20, 2025 on your regular day of collection.



Battery Collection

For curbside, place batteries in battery bag on top of organics/green bin from September 1 to 30, 2025. For condos, place batteries in battery bag and place inside designated pail in central waste area through September 2025.



Curbside Christmas Tree Collection

January 5 to 16, 2026 on your day of waste collection.

No Plastic Bags or Decorations



Landfill and Recycling Depot

The Solid Waste Disposal Site will accept most waste, even many items not acceptable for curbside pickup. For information on waste acceptance and sorting see attendant on duty.

Fees Applicable -

(interac, cash or cheque)

Mandatory sorting of metals and appliances, drywall, shingles, mattresses, brush, yard waste, wood waste (treated and untreated wood material & lumber), concrete and landfill waste.

No Charge:

Mandatory sorting of blue box recyclables, e-waste, tires, residential yard waste, textiles, household hazardous waste, styrofoam packaging, bottles for BVO (donation drop-off for deposit return containers).

Household Hazardous Waste Depot

The Depot will accept most household hazardous waste such as: paint, used oil, cleaners, solvents, batteries, light bulbs, pesticides and more items free of charge.

For Purchase:

Finished screened compost, wood chips, green bins, garbage tags and waste bin tabs.

Stationary Garbage Boxes

Proper placement and maintenance of stationary garbage boxes is important to ensure efficient collection and to not obstruct road maintenance.

Bins should be placed at the front property line, 1 metre or less from the driveway and clearly visible for collection crews. They are not permitted on the shoulder of the road or in the ditch.

The bins must remain cleared of snow, bushes and debris at all times. Maintenance of the bins is fully the responsibility of the homeowner.

To avoid missed collection, please ensure that the waste indicator tab is affixed and tethered to the bin and is fully visible at all times.
