With a food truck there needs to be increased supervision of the park and clean up on a regular basis throughout the day and before closing. If you do not have regular clean up the food truck will increase pollution and the waste food will attract more rodents and seagulls.</li> <li>Are you going to develop a schedule to clean the washrooms regularly during the day?</li> <li>The food truck should be located close to the washrooms and away from any neighbours to avoid the smell, garbage and rodents inferring with people's property.</li> </ul>

Duncan Rydall Town Fire Dept.	<ul> <li>TSSA Fuels Safety Program (Reference No. FS-056-06) will need to be complied with for Refreshment Vehicles on Town property.</li> <li>The vendor will have to provide the Town with a valid (annual) inspection from a TSSA licensed technician.</li> <li>A fire inspection would be required to review distances from combustibles, NFPA 96 compliance, and any other hazard.</li> </ul>
Emily Martin Saugeen Ojibway Nation	<ul> <li>We have no further comments on this project.</li> <li>If anything of archeological interest is revealed on site please contact the SON Environment Office immediately.</li> </ul>
Becky Hillyer County of Grey	<ul> <li>The County's Economic Development Department has reviewed the subject application.</li> <li>The Economic Development Department has "no concerns" and offers any support that the Town might require finalizing any policies or by-laws pertaining to mobile refreshment vehicles.</li> </ul>

- The County has developed a Corporate Procedure and Agreement document related to mobile food vendors on County Properties, which could be useful reference documents for the Town.
- Regarding Heathcote Park our Transportation staff raised concerns regarding the existing entrance as it likely does not meet standards for public recreation and/or commercial use. They suggest the Town consider upgrading the entrance to a commercial standard in anticipation of increased traffic flows resulting from refreshment vehicles on site.
- In summary, provided that safe access is available to all sites, and that positive, site-specific comments are received from the Conservation Authority, the County has no further concerns with the subject application.
