A. Recommendations

THAT Council receive Staff Report FAF.20.110, entitled "Follow up to Staff Report FAF.20.104 COVID-19 Phase 1 Reopening Plan";

AND THAT Council approve the implementation of a resident card program that (Option A) includes/(Option B) excludes eligibility for licensed Short Term Accommodation properties;

AND THAT Council direct that a By-law be enacted at the June 29, 2020 Council Meeting to include a new Schedule "E" and Schedule "F" to Parking By-law 2003-11 that will regulate the placing, standing, stopping or parking of an object or vehicle on specific streets from June 30th until October 31st, 2020, as attached to this staff report.

AND THAT Council acknowledge that the enactment of a new Schedule "E" and Schedule "F" to By-law 2003-11, being the Parking By-law as amended, that will limit parking on the streets identified in Attachment 1 for the period of June 30th until October 31st, 2020 is proposed in accordance with the "Emergency Provision" section of the Town Policy "Provision of Notice and Manner of Giving Notice to the Public Policy, POL.COR.07.03" that states:

Emergency Provision

If a matter or situation arises that, in the opinion of the Chief Administrative Officer or designate, is considered to be of an urgent or time sensitive nature, or could affect the health and well-being of the residents of the Town, or if a state of emergency is declared, or is so directed by a Provincial Ministry, the notice provisions may be waived and best efforts should be made to provide as such notice as is reasonable under the circumstances.

Parking Fee Structure

AND THAT Council approve Option 1 of this Report to maintain the current \$10.00 per hour rate for Non-Resident Only Parking Fee;

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OR

AND THAT due to the COVID-19 related impacts and increased operational expenses to manage parks, Council waives the provisions of the "Provision of Notice and Manner of Giving Notice to the Public, Policy POL.COR.07.03" as it relates to the approval of fees and charges and public consultation on budget priorities to approve a new parking fee structure, from \$10.00 per hour for Non-Resident Only Fee as approved in the 2020 Fees and Charges By-law, and approve Fees and Charge as outlined in Option(s) as outlined in this report;

Emergency Provision

If a matter or situation arises that, in the opinion of the Chief Administrative Officer or designate, is considered to be of an urgent or time sensitive nature, or could affect the health and well-being of the residents of the Town, or if a state of emergency is declared, or is so directed by a Provincial Ministry, the notice provisions may be waived and best efforts should be made to provide as such notice as is reasonable under the circumstances.

B. Overview

This report is a follow up to Staff Report FAF.20.104 to provide Council with additional time to consider the inclusion or exclusion of streets and roads that would be established to prohibit and or limit parking on streets specific to provide tools to control potential parking and overcrowding concerns.

C. Background

Staff Report FAF.20.104, entitled "COVID-19 Phase 1 Reopening Plan", was brought directly to the June 15, 2020 meeting of Council as directed by Council. This follow up staff report provides additional information about the streets and roadways included in the "Parking Bylaw" as well as provides Council with more time for consideration of this matter.

D. Analysis

2020 Resident Card

Staff have included an example of a proposed Resident Card that is recommended to be circulated to all property owners within the Town of The Blue Mountains (Attachment 1). Each property owner will be provided with two (2) resident cards to be used as identification for parking in "Paid Parking" identified areas and entrance into the Town's Landfill Site.

Staff intend to develop a formalized system that can provide a more robust and modernized resident card program. Staff are currently working with The Blue Mountains Public Library on the possibility of using the existing system that the Library uses to manage and produce their

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Library Cards. Staff suggest that this system could produce a formal Resident Card that would work with the new paid parking system being considered for implementation in 2020.

Staff are requesting direction from Council with regards to whether or not licensed Short Term Accommodations and Numbered Companies would be issued Resident Cards as per the following options:

Option A: Council approve the implementation of a Resident Card program that includes eligibility for licensed Short Term Accommodation properties.

Option B: Council approve the implementation of a Resident Card program that excludes eligibility for licensed Short Term Accommodation properties.

On-Street Parking By-law

Staff report FAF.20.104 focused on Section 6 of the existing By-law 2003-11 that provides the ability to enforce no parking, no standing and no stopping on streets identified in Attachment 2 of this report. Staff have reflected on the input received from residents along with the discussion at the June 15, 2020 Council meeting and have revised the list to now include flexibility under Section 7: Time Limit Parking and have revised this to allow for on-street parking during specific ranges of time.

As noted in the previous staff report, staff suggested that (as when the shale beach was closed to vehicular access) secondary and adjacent streets became parking areas for waterfront access. This extension to the current By-law would limit on-street parking until October 31, 2020.

If approved, Staff will install a series of signs that will identify the streets that have been included in Schedule "E" and Schedule "F" of the proposed By-law.

Emergency Provision

The Town's "Provision of Notice and Manner of Giving Notice to the Public Policy, POL.COR.07.03" provides that if a matter or situation arises that, in the opinion of the Chief Administrative Officer or designate, is considered to be of an urgent or time sensitive nature, or could affect the health and well-being of the residents of the Town, or if a state of emergency is declared, or is so directed by a Provincial Ministry, the notice provisions may be waived and best efforts should be made to provide as such notice as is reasonable under the circumstances.

This report is recommending that a new Schedule "E" to the Town's Parking By-law 2003-11, be enacted to limit parking on specific streets for the period of June 30, 2020 to October 31, 2020, it being noted that the Town's annual "No On-Street Parking During Winter Maintenance" begins November 1.

As noted in the previous report, staff intend to enforce the no parking rules and will utilize Section 10 of the By-law "Continued Violations".

Paid Parking Program

The 2020 approved budget included implementation of a paid parking program. The proposed fee structure, as outlined in the Fees and Charges By-law, included a \$10.00 per hour Non-Resident Fee.

With regards to the recommendation to waive the Notice Policy to amend the Fees and Charges By-law relating to the Parking Hourly Rate (Non-Resident only), Staff are seeking guidance and direction from Council as to how to proceed. Staff has provided the following options for Council to consider:

Option 1

Maintain \$10.00 per hour parking for Non-Residents/Non-Property Owner as approved in the 2020 Budget

Option 2 (Includes various options with dollar amounts and maximum hours for discussion)

By-Law Number 2020 -

Being a By-law to amend By-law 2003-11, as amended, being a By-law to regulate the placing, standing, stopping or parking of an object or vehicle on highways within the Town of The Blue Mountains

WHEREAS Section 11(3) of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 2001, c.25 provides that a lower tier municipality may pass By-laws respecting matters within the spheres of jurisdiction set out therein, including parking on highways;

AND WHEREAS Council of The Corporation of the Town of The Blue Mountains has enacted Bylaw 2003-11 to regulate the placing, standing, stopping or parking of an object or vehicle on highways within the Town of The Blue Mountains;

AND WHEREAS Council of The Corporation of the Town of The Blue Mountains has received staff report "FAF.20.110 Follow Up to Staff Report FAF.20.104 COVID-19 Phase 1 Reopening Plan" and deems it appropriate to amend By-law 2003-11;

NOW THEREFORE, Council of The Corporation of the Town of The Blue Mountains hereby enacts as follows:

- 1. That By-law 2003-11 is hereby amended by adding a new Schedule "E" and Schedule "F" as attached to this By-law;
- 2. That Section 6.0 of By-Law 2003-11 be repealed and replaced with the following new Section 6.0:

6. NO PARKING AREAS

When authorized signs have been erected, the highways as set out in Schedule "A", Schedule "B", Schedule "C", Schedule "D" and Schedule "E" attached hereto shall be deemed no parking, no standing and no stopping areas in the areas described therein.

3. That Section 7.0 of By-Law 2003-11 be repealed and replaced with the following new Section 7.0:

7. TIME LIMIT PARKING

Where authorized signs have been erected, the highways as set out in Schedule "B" and Schedule "F" attached hereto shall be deemed time limited parking and no person shall park a vehicle on the highway for more than the time limit posted thereon.
