

# By-law to Establish and Regulate a Fire Department, and to Repeal By-law 2012-65, being the current By-law to Establish and Regulate a Fire Department

Public Meeting: December 14, 2020 at 9:00 am (Virtual - Online format using Microsoft Teams)

### What is being proposed?

The Fire Protection and Prevention Act, section 2, requires every municipality to establish a program which must include public education with respect to fire safety and certain components of fire prevention, and to provide such other fire protection services as it determines may be necessary in accordance with its needs and circumstances in a community. Section 5 of this same Act authorizes the Council of a municipality to establish, maintain and operate a Fire Department to provide fire suppression services and other fire protection services in the municipality.

In 2019, the Town of The Blue Mountains Fire Department was restructured. A recent review of the Fire Department's current Establishing and Regulating By-law 2012-65 was conducted and a need for revision was identified. The draft by-law provides information and directives in the document related definitions for the By-Law, Fire Department structure, approved services and programs, limited service, responses within and outside the Town, Fire Chief responsibilities and authority, powers, recovery of costs, and other standard agreement language.
