Each representative has the authority to speak on behalf of their board. The eight boards represent 371 households which span from the extremities and offshoots of Eastridge Dr., Westridge Dr., the west side of Lora Bay Drive, the south side of Sunset Blvd. and The Cottages Collection. Lora Bay will expand to approximately 1200 homes upon completion, not including the waterfront homes along Sunset Blvd. (A list of LBCC members and the boards they represent is at the end of this letter.)The LBCC is concerned about traffic safety on Lora Bay Drive and Sunset Blvd. and would like your committee to consider these areas of concern:-There are no speed limit signs on Lora Bay Drive and many drivers are not aware that the speed limit is 50 km/hr (the default speed limit in the Town of The Blue Mountains)-The roundabout at the intersection of Lora Bay Drive/Eastridge Drive and Westridge Drive, plus the Georgian Trail and the Golf Cart path has no definitive right-of-way signage showing who has the right-of-way and who should yield. Pedestrians, cyclists, golf carts and vehicular traffic all come together at this intersection. The current signs show "Pedestrian" and "Golf Cart Xing" but do not specify whether pedestrians and/or golf carts, or vehicles have the right-of-waySunset Blvd. has signs posted for a speed limit of 50 km/hr which, in the opinion of our LBCC members is too fast for the conditions – there are no sidewalks or off-road paths for much of this stretch and pedestrians are mixing with vehicular traffic.
