

Treetrust TBM Local Native Tree Seedling Project: Final report February 4, 2022

## **Project Description:**

With 2021 funding support from the TBM Sustainability Fund, Treetrust TBM launched a project aimed at cultivating tree seedlings from locally-sourced seeds. *The Local Native Tree Seedling Project* aimed to establish a capacity to cultivate and plant saplings grown from highly successful native trees, locally adapted to the TBM.

## Goals

The following goals were identified for this project with their completion status noted below:

- Secure agreement for Town nursery site **Completed** (located at Tomahawk)
- Prepare site (soil test, soil amendment, tilling, as needed) <u>Completed</u> including tilling by inkind donation, use of the project funds to purchase weed barrier landscape fabric and installation of snow fencing (by TBM).
- Collect seeds from local native mature trees <u>Completed</u>. Seeds were collected from 3
  Treetrust TBM trees and also from several 100+ year old trees in the TBM area (including
  acorns from the Beaver River Trail and other seed sources from local land owners). Note
  that we also located, dug up and transplanted seedlings from beneath old mature trees as
  an insurance against potential low seed germination and also as a "jump start" on the size of
  saplings.
- Attempt germination of 200 seeds <u>Completed</u>. Note: Planted maple seeds and acorns into the nursery in October but no report of germination results possible until late Spring 2022.
- Media and community engagement and direct resident engagement /volunteers —
  <u>Completed</u> (but will continue indefinitely). 2021 activities included several media pieces
  and successful direct residential engagement /volunteers for seed and sapling harvesting
  (see attached press release which includes a list of volunteers and local land owners who
  made appropriate seed sources or seedlings available).
- Education <u>Initiated but will be completed in spring</u>. Covid restrictions have affected our plans for indoor classroom visits however, we have made arrangements with the Beaver Valley Community School and the Wild School in Kimbercote for educational sessions when the weather permits outdoor classes. .
